NC CCHC Annual Survey Data Report – 2022

The annual survey is sent to all active CCHCs in North Carolina January each year. CCHCs are asked to respond based on their activity over the prior calendar year, 2021. To maintain confidentiality, all data is de-identified before sharing. This survey is optional, and CCHCs choose whether to respond any of the questions within the survey. As CCHCs are able to skip certain questions, we have provided the total number of responses for all questions.

An additional four CCHCs that were in the NC CCHC Course that started January 2022 did not respond to the survey as they were not hired into their positions at the time the survey was distributed.


